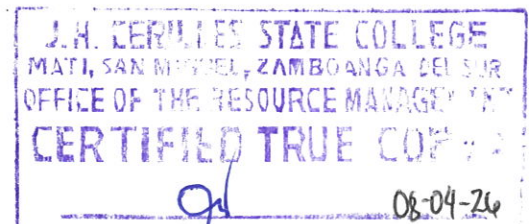

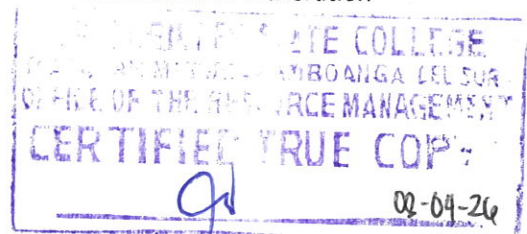

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (BOT) meet at the Pagadian City Campus, West Capitol Road, Barangay Balangasan, Pagadian City, Zamboanga Del Sur on July 25, 2025;

WHEREAS, the Community Extension Services Office (CESO) of J.H. Cerilles State College, established in 2002, is mandated to plan, coordinate, and oversee all community extension activities of the institution, in collaboration with academic departments, and aligned with the actual needs of the communities served;

WHEREAS, the College's extension programs are guided by the T.A.B.A.N.G.E. Framework initiated by President Edgardo H. Rosales, which stands for Technology and Literacy, Agriculture and Aquatic Resources, Barangay Empowerment, Adopt-a-Community, Nutrition and Health, Gender and Livelihood, and Environmental Conservation;

WHEREAS, CESO has identified a total of thirty-one (31) extension projects to be implemented across various communities in Zamboanga del Sur, with the participation of 175 faculty extensionists, in partnership with 37 government and non-government agencies, targeting an estimated 3,794 beneficiaries, and aiming to formalize 13 MOAs, with an expected satisfaction rate of 94.72%;

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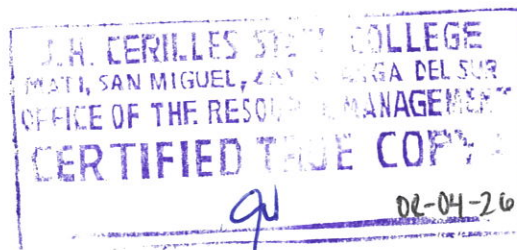

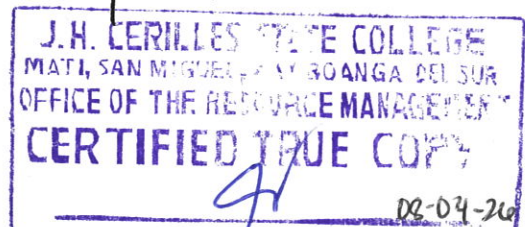

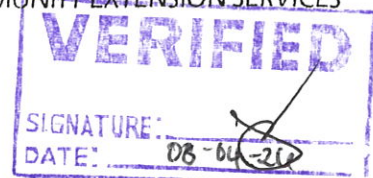

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING OF EXTERNAL LINKAGES

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENT:

This memorandum of undertaking (MOU) entered into this 29th day of November 2025, by and among:

The **J.H. CERILLES STATE COLLEGE**, a government higher education institution under Republic of the Philippines with four-fold functions: instruction, production, research and community extension, represent by its President, **EDGARDO H. ROSALES, EdD, JD** with postal address at Barangay Mati, San Miguel, Zamboanga Del Sur, hereinafter referred to as the "State College"

Rural Health Unit Tukuran, represented by **DR. KING Q. CARITATIVO, RN, MD**, Municipal Health Officer at Tukuran, Zamboanga del Sur, hereinafter referred to as "Rural Health Unit";

Office of the Senior Citizens Affairs- Buenavista, represented by OSCA-Buenavista Chapter President, **Hon. Maxima T. Papa**, with postal address, Purok Gawad Kalinga, Buenavista, Pagadian City;

- and -

The **BARANGAY BUENAVISTA, PAGADIAN CITY** a community, mandated to serve its constituents for the sake of and helping them achieve development of total well-being and the economic advancement of the communities it serves represented herein by its **Brgy. Captain, Hon. Polito R. Briones**.

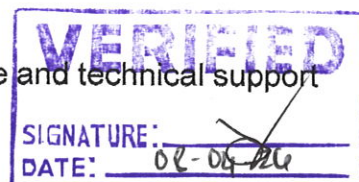
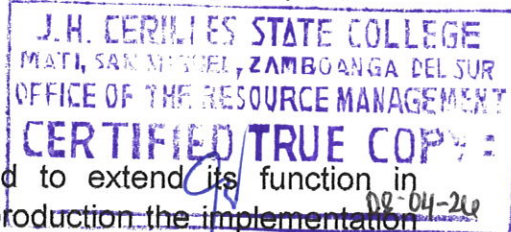

The **PROJECT NARS CARE through Older Adult Nurses "Himsog na Panglawas ni Lolo ug Lola: Atong Responsibilidad ug Adbokasiya"** composed of older adults or commonly referred to as Senior Citizens of Barangay Buenavista, Pagadian City represented by its Barangay Captain, hereinafter referred to as the "**BENEFICIARY**".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the **STATE COLLEGE**, is mandated to extend its function in instruction, research, community extension services and production the implementation of **PROJECT NARS CARE** for older adults in support to focal function of the state colleges;

WHEREAS, the **Rural Heath Unit**, offer a medical expertise and technical support in the implementation of health - related programs.



WHEREAS, the **OSCA**. seeks to protect the rights and promote the welfare of senior citizens;

WHEREAS, all parties agree to join forces to support public health care initiatives, promote health education, and deliver health care services to the community.

WHEREAS, the **BENEFICIARIES** consist of one hundred (100) members under the **PROJECT NARS CARE** through Older Adult Nurses, who are identified as individuals in need of support to improve their health and quality of life, as they typically have limited access to medical, health, and social resources, making them more vulnerable to health risks and reduced well-being; and this need-based initiative of J.H. Cerilles State College aims to provide psychosocial support, promote overall well-being, enhance livelihood and employment opportunities, encourage environmental stewardship, and foster a peaceful and resilient community, with the ultimate goal of improving the beneficiaries' quality of life, resilience, and socioeconomic productivity through collaborative interventions.

Now, **THEREFORE**, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the hereto agree to the following terms and conditions.

ARTICLE 1 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

Section 1. Responsibilities of JH Cerilles State College (JHCSC)

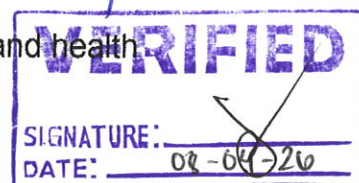
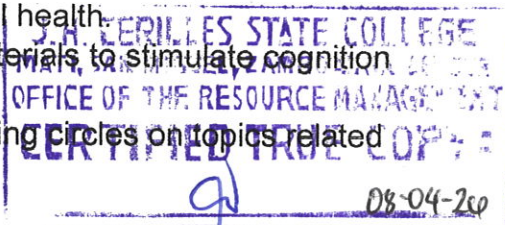
1. Lead research, extension activities, and community development initiatives under this MOU.
2. Deploy faculty and students to assist in health, literacy, training, and outreach activities.
3. Ensure that ethical and professional standards are observed in all activities.
4. Provide documentation, reports, and program outputs to partner agencies.

Section 2. Responsibilities of JHCSC – Library

1. Promote Spiritual Well-being by curating and making available inspirational, faith-based, and values-oriented reading materials that foster peace and hope among older adults.
2. Collaborate with faith-based and civic organizations to conduct spiritual talks, reflective readings, and guided meditations.
3. Support Diversional and Recreational Activities by organizing reading and storytelling sessions, arts and crafts workshops, and music appreciation programs to promote creativity and joy.
4. Encourage intergenerational literacy activities involving nursing students and older adults to enhance social connection and learning.
5. Develop therapeutic engagements such as poetry reading, journaling, and shared book discussions to support emotional health.
6. Provide educational and wellness-related materials to stimulate cognition and promote healthy living.
7. Conduct short lectures, film viewings, or reading circles on topics related to resilience, wellness, and personal growth.

Section 3. Responsibilities of RHU Tukuran

1. Provide access to community health services, health data, and health professionals for program activities.



2. Offer supervision and guidance to students during community health fieldwork.
3. Collaborate in medical missions, health screenings, and capacity-building activities.
4. Coordinate in monitoring and evaluation of health-related outcomes.

Section 4. Responsibilities of Barangay Buenavista

1. Facilitate community access, mobilization, and barangay-level coordination.
2. Provide venues, logistical support, and manpower when necessary.
3. Assist in identifying community needs and priority areas for intervention.
4. Endorse and support all activities implemented within the barangay.

Section 5. Responsibilities of OSCA – Pagadian City

1. Coordinate activities for senior citizens, including health, literacy, and resilience programs.
2. Provide demographic data and assist in identifying senior citizen beneficiaries.
3. Facilitate barangay- and city-level coordination for senior citizen activities.
4. Participate in monitoring and evaluating program outcomes affecting the elderly.

ARTICLE II DATA PRIVACY AND CONFIDENTIALITY

All Parties shall ensure full compliance with RA 10173 (Data Privacy Act of 2012). Sensitive personal information (health, age, records) shall be safeguarded with:

- Strict confidentiality
- Secure storage
- Restricted access
- No data shall be shared without appropriate Data Sharing Agreement (DSA) and consent forms.
- The STATE COLLEGE shall serve as Personal Information Controller (PIC) for student-handled data.

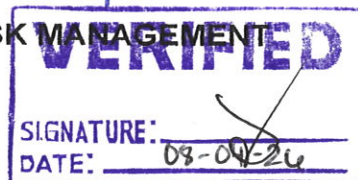
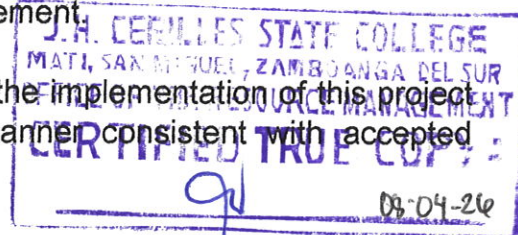
ARTICLE III INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS (IPR)

Modules, photographs, documentation, and training materials produced under this MOU shall be deemed the intellectual property of the STATE COLLEGE, unless such materials are expressly co-developed with partner agencies, in which case joint ownership shall apply in accordance with applicable intellectual property laws and written agreements of the Parties.

Partner agencies may utilize project outputs solely for non-commercial, community-based, or institutional purposes, subject to the prior written consent of the STATE COLLEGE. Any use beyond these parameters particularly for commercial or profit-oriented activities shall require a separate written agreement.

Publications, reports, or academic works arising from the implementation of this project shall acknowledge all participating partners in a manner consistent with accepted scholarly and institutional standards.

ARTICLE IV HEALTH & SAFETY, INCIDENT REPORTING, AND RISK MANAGEMENT



- DOH, DSWD, PRC, and LGU health and safety standards shall govern all activities.
- Emergency response mechanisms must be in place during activities.
- Any injury or incident must be reported within 24 hours to all concerned parties.
- Students must be supervised by licensed professionals at all times.

ARTICLE V LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION

- Each Party shall be liable for acts of gross negligence or willful misconduct of its employees or participants.
- No Party shall be liable for acts of the other arising from independent negligence.
- The STATE COLLEGE shall not be held financially liable for any medical emergencies unless covered by a separate agreement.
- The Beneficiary acknowledges the voluntary nature of the program.

ARTICLE VI NO FUND TRANSFER / FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT

- This MOU does not involve transfer of funds.
- Any future financial commitments shall require a separate written instrument, subject to COA and CHED rules.

ARTICLE VII MONITORING AND EVALUATION

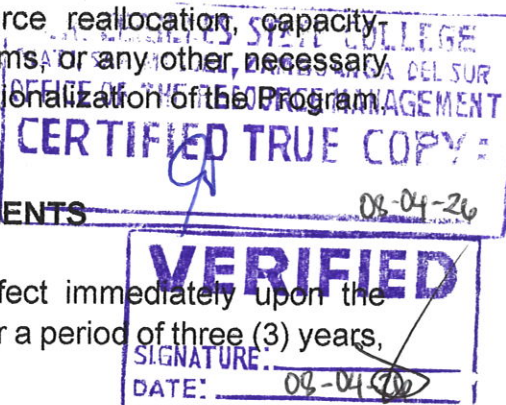
A Joint Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) Team shall be constituted by the Parties to ensure the effective oversight, implementation, and continuous improvement of the Program. The M&E Team shall be composed of duly designated representatives from each Party, who shall be responsible for conducting periodic site visits, validating submitted reports, ensuring compliance with agreed standards, and addressing operational concerns that may arise during the implementation period.

The Parties further agree that Quarterly Progress Reports shall be prepared and submitted by the M&E Team. These reports shall include, but not be limited to: (a) accomplishment updates; (b) assessment of performance indicators; (c) compliance with timelines; (d) identified gaps, risks, or deviations; and (e) corresponding corrective actions or recommendations. Such reports shall serve as the official documentation of the Program's status and shall be furnished to the appropriate offices of both Parties for information, evaluation, and guidance.

The findings and recommendations arising from the M&E activities and quarterly reports shall serve as the basis for sustainability strategies and continuous improvement measures. These may include policy adjustments, resource reallocation, capacity building interventions, enhancement of processes and systems, or any other necessary actions to ensure the long-term viability, efficiency, and institutionalization of the Program.

ARTICLE VIII TERM, TERMINATION, AND AMENDMENTS

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) shall take effect immediately upon the signing of all Parties and shall remain in full force and effect for a period of three (3) years.



unless earlier terminated in accordance with the provisions herein. The Parties may mutually agree to renew or extend the term of this MOU through a written instrument executed prior to its expiration.

Any Party may, for justified reasons, terminate this MOU by providing at least thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the other Parties. The notice shall clearly state the intention to terminate and the effective date of such termination. Termination shall not relieve any Party of its obligations that have already accrued prior to the effective date of termination, unless otherwise mutually agreed upon in writing.

Any amendments, revisions, or modifications to this MOU shall be valid only if reduced into writing and duly signed by all Parties. No verbal agreement, waiver, or informal understanding shall have the effect of altering, modifying, or superseding the terms and conditions of this MOU.

ARTICLE IX FORCE MAJEURE

In line with Article 1174 of the Civil Code, no Party shall be held liable for the failure to perform its obligations when such failure is directly caused by a fortuitous event or force majeure beyond its control and which could not have been foreseen or, if foreseen, was unavoidable. The Party invoking this provision shall promptly notify the other Parties in writing and shall resume performance as soon as the effects of the fortuitous event have ceased.

ARTICLE X DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The Parties shall exert all reasonable efforts to resolve any dispute amicably through dialogue and negotiation. Should the Parties fail to reach an amicable settlement, the matter shall be referred to mediation pursuant to Republic Act No. 9285, otherwise known as the Alternative Dispute Resolution Act of 2004. Mediation shall be conducted through an accredited mediator or mediation center mutually agreed upon by the Parties.

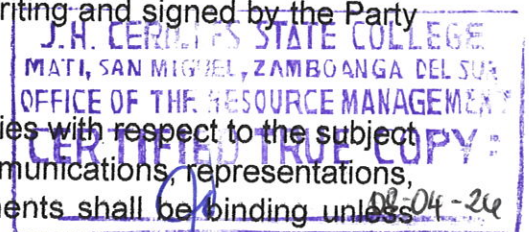
ARTICLE XII SEPARABILITY, NON-WAIVER, AND ENTIRE AGREEMENT

If any provision of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is declared invalid, illegal, or unenforceable by competent authority, such invalidity shall apply only to the specific provision involved and shall not affect the remaining provisions, which shall continue to be valid and enforceable.

No failure or delay by any Party in exercising any right or remedy under this MOU shall be construed as a waiver thereof. Any waiver must be in writing and signed by the Party granting it.

This MOU constitutes the entire agreement among the Parties with respect to the subject matter herein and supersedes all prior verbal or written communications, representations, or understandings. No other terms, conditions, or agreements shall be binding unless embodied in a written instrument duly signed by all Parties.

ARTICLE XIII

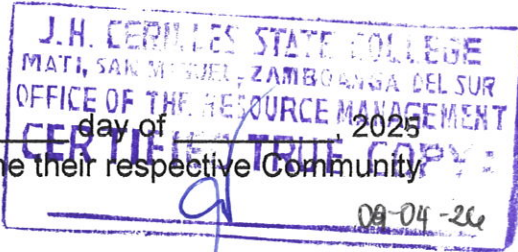
